MEET NEW SHRINE IMPERIAL POTENTATE, CHRIS L SMITH



Smith was elected Imperial Potentate, part of the 12-member body that helps govern the Shriners fraternity, during the Shriners' 2016 Imperial Session – held in Tampa, Florida, July 3 - July 7.

Smith was raised a Master Mason at Whitehaven Masonic Lodge #599 at the age of 21. Smith is a member of the Memphis Scottish Rite and York Rite bodies of Mississippi. In 1978, Smith was made a 32nd degree Scottish Rite Mason, and later a Knight Commander of the Court of Honour.

Originally, Smith became a member of Al Chymia Shriners in Memphis, Tennessee, but he later moved and became a member of Wahabi Shriners in Jackson, Mississippi, where he served as Potentate in 2004. Smith is also an active member of the Olive Branch Shrine Club, where he served as president. MEET NEW SHRINE IMPERIAL CAPTAIN OF THE GUARD, RICHARD BURKE



He was elected Imperial Captain of the Guard, part of the 12-member body that helps govern the Shriners fraternity, during the Shriners' 2016 Imperial Session – held in Tampa, Florida, July 3 - July 7.

Burke was raised a Master Mason in Buford Lodge #292, and became a member of Yaarab Shriners in Atlanta in 2003. He joined Gwinnett Shrine Club, where he served as President in 2006. He received numerous awards for his fundraising efforts and served on the Divan of Yaarab Shriners from 2008 to 2014, serving as Potentate in 2014. Burke also served as Regional Imperial Public Relations Director for the Southeast from 2009 to 2013. He is a member of the Royal Order of Jesters, Order of Quetzalcoatl, and is a 32nd Degree Scottish Rite Mason.

Burke was born in Endicott, New York, and moved to Atlanta after graduating from State University of New York at Geneseo in 1979 with a Bachelor's Degree in business and minor in accounting and computer science.

Professionally, Burke worked from 1979 to 1988 as a Systems Consultant for NCR and Texas Instruments, where he specialized in accounting systems, voice recognition and artificial intelligence systems. Burke was then self-employed as an IT consultant prior to joining Payment Technologies, Inc., in 1992 as a Partner and Vice President of Information Technology. After selling their initial business, in 2002, Burke and his business partners formed a successful internet venture, Financial Operations Networks, LLC. He has been a Scottish Rite Mason since 1985, and a York Rite Mason since 1999. In 1999, he received the prestigious York Rite Merit Award. He was inducted into Royal Order of Scotland in 2007. Pittman joined Yaarab Shriners in Atlanta, Georgia, in 1985, and served as Potentate in 2013. OLD FRIENDS REUNITED AT 2016 IMPERIAL SESSION

At the recent Imperial Session in Tampa, Fla., I represented the Yaarab Red Devil Clowns at the ISCA Clown Competition. I was fortunate enough to score a second place award in the Tramp category, another second place in the One-Man skit category and third place award in a combined unit skit with two other clowns from Lulu Shrine. But the greatest award for me was being reunited with a beautiful young lady whom I've known for many years, Megan Johnson. The following is a short story of her life and accomplishments.

Born in Korea, Megan (an orphan) was adopted when she was 7 months old. After being brought to the states she was diagnosed with having bilateral cleft lip and palate, a condition where the tissues of the mouth and lip form improperly causing serious cosmetic issues as well as problems with hearing, eating, breathing and speaking. Additionally, she has hemi facial dysplasia which is a condition where the bones in her face grow at different rates. After several unsuccessful surgeries at the local hospital, Megan was referred to Shriners Hospitals for Children – Portland, Oregon when she was five years old. Having received more than 30 surgical procedures through the years, the one thing that made each operation bearable were the Shrine clowns that came to visit her and the other kids while they were in the hospital. Megan has always had a special love for the Shrine clowns and visits with them at every opportunity. The picture to the left is Megan and R.C. in Tampa, Fla.

Megan, who just turned 23, is a one-woman powerhouse who put aside her own challenges and started her own charity – at the age of 10 – called “**Megan’s Mission**” which continues to provide and personally deliver hats, scarves and gloves to the homeless of Seattle. She has authored, illustrated and published three children’s books to benefit charity; speaks to school groups to help children understand differences in people to help stop bullying; and is a tireless fundraiser (and cheerleader) for Shriners Hospitals for Children. Megan was also picked by the Shrine Public Relations Committee to be a poster child and has served as a Shrine Hospital National Patient Ambassador for the past 10 years. Megan also provides financial contributions to several local charities focusing on the homeless and at-risk children. Megan has grown her mission to include a unique partnership with the Monroe Correction Complex in Monroe, Wash., called Giving Back, where inmates have made hundreds of hats that are distributed to the homeless and others in need.

Megan has received many awards in her young life, The National Jefferson Award (the Nobel Peace Prize for Community Service), The National Young Woman of Distinction Award, The American Red Cross “Hero Award” and the National Outstanding Youth Award; just to name a few.

Megan is a nursing student and will soon graduate were in she hopes to further her commitment by becoming a nurse at the Shriners Hospitals for Children. We are very proud of Megan, her remarkable accomplishments and dedication to her community and to Shriners Hospitals for Children.

We both have similar complaints, but we know in the end we will feel better and try not to let our temporary situation get us down. Sam also reminds me that we need to get all the articles together for the upcoming Basharat. I know this is true, but sometimes it's hard to get motivated for this, especially when you're not feeling 100 percent. So I go to the archives and look through old issues of the Basharat. I came across an article written by our Chaplain and Editor (at that time), Dr. James Bryant. Dr. Bryant could take a simple story and make it seem so compelling; sort of like a Paul Harvey version of “The rest of the story.” This particular article is about a young girl that in her later years would overcome an obstacle that changed her life as well as many others.

Anna Mary Robertson was hired-on to work on a farm as a young girl. She later married one of the farmer's sons', Tom Moses. They moved to a farm of their own and raised ten children. She spent days working on the farm and raising children and spent most evenings doing needle work. When she turned eighty years old, her fingers stiffened with arthritis until she could no longer hold a needle. Instead of groping in self-pity and misery she decided to take up painting. She discovered that she had a real knack for painting farm scenes.

One day an art dealer passing through her town saw one of her paintings on display at the drugstore and launched her into a career as a painter of “Americana”. During the following years she painted over fifteen hundred paintings. Twenty five percent of these were done after she turned **One Hundred** years old. When asked why she became a painter, she said, “Because my hands were too stiff to do needlework”. You may recall the lady's professional name; Grandma Moses.

Life is hard. People either grope in it or cope with it. The over comers have learned that with God's help they can often turn adversity into opportunity. We as Shriners, see this every time we go to one of our Shriners Hospitals for Children. The secret of learning to cope with adversity is in the “transcendent power” of God. It was Lady Twyla's idea to start a club for the widows and widowers to join and be with others that had suffered the same loss as they had. Not only would it be good therapy for all involved, it would also give them a reason for feeling like they still belonged.

On August 31st, 1996, an organizational meeting was called to order by First Lady Twyla Zelack to form a club for the widows and widowers of Yaarab Shrine. There were 41 members and 10 guests present. The Officers elected were as follows: Twyla Zelack-Charter president for the remainder of the year; Doris Howell-vice president; Meg Vagle-secretary; and Mary McClain-treasurer. Meetings were set to be held on the fourth Wednesday of each month and dues would be \$10.00 a year. At the following monthly meeting it was advised that the Widows and Widowers would not be considered a social club but recognized as an association.

Throughout the years, this group has continued to grow and has become one of the most active associations within Yaarab Shrine. You will see them at the Annual Circus Kickoff working the taco salad line, working tirelessly at the Circus each year with the Shrine ladies check-in and also assisting at Yaarab Shrine with any task that they are asked to do. They are always willing to help with any project. Also, they have regular outings for their members and encourage others to join them as well.



- Mishandled fireworks can result in severe burns, scars and disfigurements that can last a lifetime
- Families should attend community fireworks displays handled by professionals rather than using fireworks at home

LAWNMOWER SAFETY

- Only use a mower with a control that stops the mower blade from moving if the handle is let go
- Children younger than 16 years old should not be allowed to use ride-on mower. Children under 12 years old should not use walk-behind mowers
- Wear appropriate shoes and clothing
- Never smoke or use any type of flame around gasoline
- Gasoline has one purpose - to fuel an engine



DOG SAFETY



- Consult with a professional to learn what breeds of dogs are the best fit for your household
- Dogs with histories of aggression are not suitable for households with children
- Be sensitive to cues that a child is fearful or apprehensive about a dog. If a child seems frightened by dogs, wait before bringing a dog into your household
- Spend time with a dog before buying or adopting it. Use caution when bringing a dog into a household with an infant or toddler.





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
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
